STATEMENT OF PURPOUSE

I first discovered my love for the performing arts through Bharatanatyam. As a child my parents used to take me to concerts & dance dramas at Kalakshetra. I would watch the dancers graceful movements with fascination and spend hours trying to imitate them in front of the mirror, draped in my mother's dupatta. My parents enrolled me in the esteemed Kalakshetra Foundation where I spent six years learning the nuances of music, rhythm, storytelling and conveying emotions through Abhinaya, Mudras, and body movements.

Theatre was something I always wanted to try my hand at. In 2016, I finally got the opportunity to explore it when I performed in The Little Theater's Annual Christmas Pantomime production. We underwent 3 months of training in improv theater for the show. My training in Bharatanatyam helped me connect with the concepts naturally, and theatre unlocked a new creative freedom within me.
